## SGT. KIM VICKERS ABILENE POLICE DEPARTMENT



Division Sergeant for the Abilene Police Department, Sgt. Vickers discussed the offenses and crimes that are handled by his division. He also discussed the juvenile system of punishment vs. the adult system. Here juveniles are given a second chance, being offered rehab instead of punishment for their wrong doings. This is one of the premier youth divisions in the country and one that secures complete confidentiality to protect the child.

Sgt. Vickers talked about juvenile crime here in Abilene noting that it is steadily decreasing, there are no gangs-compared to other cities, with most juvenile crimes involving theft and burglary, these crimes are crimes of opportunity, and occur between 4-8 pm.

An important part of his presentation was discussing today's juvenile crime vs. the past. Here the biggest change in juvenile crime is the parents and the

number of grandparents that are raising children today. Nationwide, juvenile crime has gotten more violent, more deadly weapons are being used while the use of drugs has remained fairly constant, and Marijuana has remained prevalent throughout the years. The internet has become a part of everyday life and kids use it as a form of communication and expression. It is not a juvenile crime issue but more of a victim issue. Think about it! The internet today is America's Bathroom wall. It was a most informative topic and many Kiwanians were able to direct their questions to Sgt. Vickers.
