C. RAY DAVIS

Ray Davis had a stellar 38 year career in the computer industry that began when computers were room-size and the words hardware and software made no sense. His career opportunities progressed from Software & Systems Engineer to Vice President, Federal Government Programs.

In the Apollo Program at NASA he led the design and development of a communications oriented real-time Operating System for Mission Control at the Manned Spacecraft Center in Houston, Texas.

Offering a rare blend of creative and operational strengths, he led the completion (ahead of schedule & below budget) of a Simulation program for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) that had been determined to be "undoable".

Through his extensive leadership experience and detailed knowledge of systems development Ray was acknowledged by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) for saving the agency more than \$500M on a "Just-in-Time" method for inventory management.

His organization was a leader in the cutting edge field of biometrics, providing some of the initial Facial Recognition Software.


Ray's exceptional track record in information technology services and solutions earned the moniker, "Straight Shooter and a Tree Shaker". He assembled a proverbial "Who's Who Team" that successfully provided the IT Infrastructure for the newly formed Transportation Security Administration (TSA), now a part of Homeland Security.

Ray received numerous commendations from government and industry for innovations in Information Technology Services and Leadership Excellence. These include the Presidential Medal of Freedom and the Vice President's Hammer Award.

She attributes her love of books to her mother because while as a child it was her mother that became her own personal physical therapist and read to her during her therapy sessions to keep her from becoming distracted. As the military

moved her family around she was always glad to find her favorite books at the local library since her parents allowed her to read as much as she wanted. On a frequent visit to the Abilene Public Library Marie met Jenny Tatum. The same Jenny Tatum, that was to offer her first part time job to help her pay for school, when she was attending Hardin Simmons University. The rest as they say is history!

The highlight of Marie's visit was her reading of the book "EPOSSUMONDAS". She is a terrific storyteller

and she made the whole club laugh and laugh.

Marie say's that one of the best parts of her job as a children's librarian is the interaction with the children. Marie told members what the library has to offer to our children and grandchildren. Basic services such as readers advisory, reference, research assistance and hundreds of other programs each year are offered. Story times are a big hit at the library. There are programs for those a few months old up to and including family story times. Tours are offered, Information Sharing is offered, Cooperative Programs with the ZOO, Grace Museum and NCCIL are offered, Various Programs such as the Summer Reading Program and those for special occasions such as Children's Book Week, and there are also Puppet Shows.

The stats are like this; so far this year the library has conducted 1058

programs reaching 16,758 children and with information like that how could you not want to go to the library?
