She consults with 42 school districts as well as Universities, agencies, civic groups and parents to provide training and technical support in the area of autism. She has chaired the West Texas Autism Walk since its inception four years ago. Last year the walk raised \$85,500 for autism research and this year's goal is set at \$100.000.
