## Mr. Alan Eggleston, Guest Speaker

Alan Eggleston, Kiwanis Club of Abilene Member and Executive Director of the Trails Council of Boy Scouts of America, presented a portion of his workshop on personal identity theft and also spoke on Firearm Safety and the education tool made available to public schools.

He mentioned numerous tips, and common sense tools to help deter fraud.

- Credit Card Theft Protect your card. Allan gave an example from his own experience whereby a waitress at a local restaurant took his card to swipe as payment for his bill. She captured his credit card information and used the number for a purchase on the internet at walmart.com.
- Mail Fraud Shred important numbers!
- Home Intrusion-Proactive Steps to Safeguard Self Observe home, what is the greatest point of entry to the home? Don't leave the door into house from garage unlocked.
   Secure front door and windows. Tall hedges create great hiding places for burglars.
   Hedges should be no more than 2 ft high around the house.
- Answering Machine Message Do not say "we aren't home right now." Think about it, you just notified the listener that your home is unoccupied.
- Add outside lighting around your home. Burglars do not like to be seen. Alan suggested contacting the City of Abilene to inquire about the cost and indicated the monthly cost runs around \$7.00.
- Place a BEWARE of DOG sign in the window or yard. Add a water bowl next to the sign.
  It sends a message that the home is protected. Or place a sign "secured by Brinks or
  ADT."

## **IDENTITY THEFT – (Continued)**

- A peep hole in the door should be wide angle and usable at least 6 ft back instead of right at the door.
- Set timer lights for alternate times if away several days to leave the impression that someone may be home.

The program was very informative and a great reminder to pay attention to what is going on around you.




