Nadene Smith graduated from Hardin-Simons in 1886 with a BS in Speech Pathology and Audiology. After graduation, she spent 14 years working in non-profit management and fund development in Abilene and Lubbock, TX. She has taken the past 6 years off of full time work to prioritize her family.

Nadene went back to work part-time in February 2008 for Hendrick Hospice Care as a Special Events Coordinator. Her job duties at Hendrick include coordinating the children's grief programs; Club Courage and Camp Courage, as well as organizing the annual Light Up a Life fund development project. In addition, she helps market Cardiology services at Hendrick with a special emphasis on Cardiac Rehab.

Jon, Nadene, and Tucker are Christians, worshipping at Beltway Park Baptist Church.

### **MEALS ON WHEELS**

## February 25

President Russell Berry presided. Grady Jolly led the prayer, Randy Williams led the singing. Millie Braddy played piano. Sharon Jones led the Pledge of Allegiance. David Bacon introduced our guests.

Words of Wisdom today: "Leadership involves finding a parade and getting in front of it."

Ken Lenoir introduced our speaker today, Betty Bradley, Executive Director of Meals on Wheels. Director since 1975, Betty took us on an imaginary "Meals on Wheels" route, describing clients and the daily situations a driver might encounter. She painted a realistic picture of a single individual living on the south side of town whose mode of transportation was her motorized wheel chair, and a 99 year old living alone but very alert. She talked of a WWII Vet whose refrigerator was empty and a younger invalid who spent the day by himself.



Betty shared the growth of the program with new programs such as Pet Food on Wheels and Groceries on Wheels which is funded by monetary donations or food donations. Many clients receive breakfast and lunch each day now through a grant program. Volunteers are trained to provide minimal attention to needs of clients. The generosity of volunteers in Abilene is vital to the continued success of the program with approximately 1100 being served. Betty praised the Kiwanis Club of Abilene, who has consistently partnered with Meals on Wheels.

Clay Copeland, Community Services Chairman, presented a check for \$1000.00 to Meals on Wheels at the conclusion of her presentation. The funds will be used toward the Golf Tournament to be held in May as a fund raiser for Meals on Wheels. Betty accepted the check, stating the Kiwanis Club of Abilene is the only service club who has signed up as a Blue Level sponsor for this event.

**Russell** gave a recap on the involvement of the club over the years and stated that we needed to contact **Ken Lenoir** to help with the Kiwanis Club of Abilene Route.


