Students may accrue college credit through our continued partnerships with our local universities and colleges and participate in appropriate internships for career pathways during their junior and senior years.

Spiritual Aims Message...by Randy Williams

"Serendipity" is the ability of making accidental but fortuitous discoveries, especially while looking for something entirely unrelated. Sometimes this also results in our experiencing an "Epiphany," which is an ordinary event through which we receive new illumination on life.

I don't believe in coincidence. I believe that God has ordered my life in a way that draws me closer to a relationship with Him and reveals His Hand on me. Have you ever had something very unusual happen to you? Something that, on it's face, seemed to have no real significance other than being kinda weird?

I believe that these are events of which we should "stop" and take notice. God communicates with us in so many ways and yet circumstances and events seem to be most often overlooked. When this happens to you, you may need to be patient for Him to reveal what He is trying to tell you.

When you look at something that you may have known about for a long time, and suddenly you realize that it is very special, much more meaningful than you've ever acknowledged; then at that moment, you've had an epiphany. You've uncovered something that was there all

all along, but was hiding just below the surface. It wasn't so obvious. It took a second look.

In the Gospels the magi realized that Jesus was their king, too, so they went out of their way to yield to Him and bring Him the praise that He deserved. Recognizing Jesus as King is the ultimate realization that anyone can have. I'd say it's a lifechanging epiphany. Do you want to "Change the World, One Child at a Time"? Keep growing in the Lord and keep your eye out for the "Serendipity" in your life. If you look closely enough you just might find an "Epiphany".
