When I was in elementary school I was one of those kids who asked a lot of questions. My hand would go up and groans could be heard all around the room. Funny, it really never fazed me. Truth is, those questions were on the minds of a lot of other kids who just wouldn't risk themselves to ask.

An African proverb states, "The one who asks questions doesn't lose his way." Think about David. He asked plenty of questions in the Psalms. He was seeking God's guidance for the way he should go. Like, "O Lord, how long?" (6:3), a question of eagerness to see God's plan accom-

plished. Or, "What is man that You are mindful of him?" (8:4), a question of awe that God even cares about sinful man.
