CMN Telethon

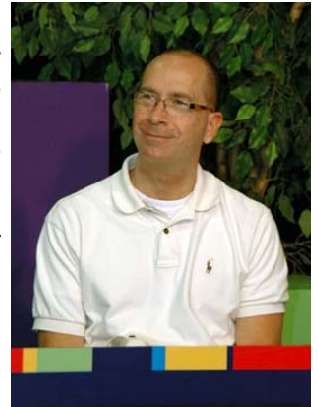


David Jones and **Mark Young** presented checks from our club to CMN at the telethon.

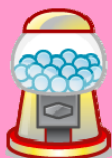
