LARRY GILLEY, City Manager June 23



City Manager Larry Gilley was introduced by retired Chief of Police Melvin Martin. As he learns of the many budget issues faced by cities across the state and nation, Mr. Gilley stated that we are fortunate to live in Abilene. The current budget issues faced by the City

are the most difficult he has seen in his 34 years in municipal government. Mr. Gilley reviewed the FY10 budget process. The budget was adopted without a tax increase for the general fund. During the current year, the City has seen a significant loss in sales tax revenues. In order to maintain a balanced budget, the City has adopted several midyear adjustments including the voluntary delay of scheduled pay increases for fire and police, a voluntary retirement program, elimination of pay increases for city staff, reduction in travel expenses, three furlough days and the elimination of two positions. There are currently 30 vacant positions within the City

that will be held open indefinitely.

Mr. Gilley commended city staff for continuing to provide great service and accept more responsibilities with fewer resources.

Even in the toughest times, the City staff have embraced the City's mission statement "We work together to build a community of the highest quality for present and future generations."

Jamie Breed led the meeting. Randy Williams led the prayer. Chris Carnohan led music. Mac Sipe led the pledge. Sheila Watts introduced guests.
