# MEDICAL MISSION TRIP TO CAMBODIA September 15

and Megan Meiser as the speakers today. Megan is the granddaughter of former member Bruce Davis and was the recipient of the Sophomore of the Year scholarship in 2005. She had accompanied Dr. Sandy on a Medical Mission Trip to Cambodia this summer.

The pair presented a very interesting program, sharing a slide show of delightful photos. Dr. Sandy communicated that Cambodia does have freedom of religion in their coun-

try; however, 90% of the country is Buddhist and approximately 5% is Christian.

Dr. Sandy and Megan served on a medical ship while there assisting approximately 150 patients daily.

Dr. Sandy told of the changes in Cambodia that occurred in the 1960's when the country was one of very modern cities. A change in government meant cities were abandoned and 2.5 million people we massacred. The educated were the victims. The devastation collapsed the cities and people were moved to country land. Today it is a poor country.

Additional photos shared were of Vietnam, which they visited as they made their way back to the

Dr. Sandy concluded by sharing that she had written three books which were offered for sale. She also shared highlights of those books titled "Wash Your Hands Please", "Total Wellness" and "You Don't Need it But your Children Do".


