W. Haynie with Homer Scott serving as the first Secretary. By 1924, the club had 60 members and club projects included purchasing "Drive Carefully" signs for schools, the purchase of two buffaloes for Fair Park, the beginning of a milk and ice fund for children, and delivering used clothes to indigent families at Christmas.

Again, as always, we will be emphasizing

obtaining new members to revitalize our club. Over the next few weeks we will be offering strategies to help in this endeavor. Kirk Hancock, over-all chairman of the various Membership Committees, will be playing a vital role in this.

The first step in finding valuable new members is to ensure they will become active, involved members and remain that way. When you, our valuable current member, finds a prospective member, please take the following steps:

- secure an application from the secretary;
- prospective member fills out the application

and attaches a \$35 fee (their share of new member fees);

- take application to Kirk Hancock for his committee to peruse;
- the president, or a member of the New Member Involvement and Education Committee, will then meet with the prospect for a very brief orientation of our Kiwanis Club;
- the application will be sent to the Board of Directors for approval;
- the new member will be inducted at the next Club meeting.

After all, many hands make light work. The more energetic Kiwanians we have, the more we can accomplish!
