THE DAY TELEVISION CAME TO CEDAR GAP, TX Wednesday, Jan. 12, 2010, Noon, Abilene Country Club

Kiwanian James Hallmark will speak on "The Day Television Came to Cedar Gap, Texas" during the Wednesday, Jan. 12, 2011, meeting of the Kiwanis Club of Abilene at noon at the Abilene Country Club.

James will share his first-hand account of the eventful day in the history of Abilene when Abilene's first television station (KRBC-TV) signed on the air. Hallmark was a staff announcer on August 30, 1953 when the switch was thrown and the era of television was ushered in. He will share his memories of the first five years of television history in this part of West Texas.

Hallmark will reminisce about



what it was like to work in an industry that was still in its infancy. He relates that "Most of us who showed up for work on the day KRBC-TV signed on the air had no television experience, had never even seen television, and certainly

had never set foot in a television studio. Almost all of us were in our early twenties and were both excited and apprehensive about the challenge we faced that hot day in August fifty-seven years ago."

Hallmark will talk about some of the other players who were a part of this historic undertaking, like Larry Fitzgerald, Dub Bowlus, Cousin Pogo and Calvin Kiwi, and Harry Holt. He will relate some of the humorous stories that occurred during those early days when all local television was live.

Relive the day when television came to Cedar Gap, Texas and the Big County through the eyes of someone who was there.

Spiritual Aims Moment

In December 2010, I lost a good friend and co-worker named Ted Dawson.

Ted, a young man, struggled with cancer and a tumor on his brainstem that was inoperable.

When he was healthy, Ted had such high energy and I've never met anyone that cared more about troubled kids.

He had been touched by a song by Natalie Grant entitled "Held". I had never heard this song until just before his memorial service on January 9, 2011. I wanted to share the lyrics with you:

"Two months is too little. They let him go. They had no sudden healing. To think that providence would take a child from his mother while she prays is appalling. Who told us we'd be rescued? What has changed and why should we be saved from nightmares? We're asking why this happens to us who have died to live? It's unfair. This is what it means to be held. How it feels when the sacred is torn from your life and you survive. This is what it is to be loved. And to know that the promise was when everything fell we'd be held. This hand is bitterness.

We want to taste it, let the hatred numb our sorrow. The wise hand opens slowly to lilies of the valley and tomorrow. If hope is born of suffering.

If this is only the beginning. Can we not wait for one hour watching for our Savior?" This past year has been very difficult for many of our club family. We have suffered loss and experienced pain which often brings us to question our God. Like the song, the word of God says in 1st Peter 4:12: "Do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your testing, as though some strange thing were happening to you. But to the degree that you share the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing." And verse 19 says: "Let those who suffer ... entrust their souls to a faithful Creator. . ." If we want to "Change the World, One Child and One Community at a Time", let them see how we turn to our God and not away from our God when troubles come.


