During his 16 years on campus, he served as vice president for finance and administration, chief financial officer, director of financial operations, director of student financial services and development officer. Prior to coming to ACU, he worked for the accounting firm of Arthur Andersen & Co.

Schubert received his B.B.A. in accounting from ACU, an M.B.A. from Duke University and an Ed.D. in higher education management from the University of Pennsylvania.



Schubert serves on the Genesis Networks Solutions and Wylie Little League boards of directors. An active member of the Southern Hills Church of Christ, he enjoys golf, outdoor exercise and coaching youth sports. Phil and his wife, Jamie (Rhoden '94), have been married for 17 years. 

Ed Norton, from the TV series "The Honeymooners" once said, "When the tides of life turn against you and the current upsets your boat, don't waste those tears on what might have been, just lay on your back and float!"

Do you ever think about how your life would have been had you made some different decisions along the way? Perhaps a different career or different family.

What if you could have lived in Hawaii or some other exotic location. What if! What might have been?

Every dollar we raise during this campaign will be used to help children.


