

Dr. Fred A. Bailey will present our Thanksgiving program this week. His intriguing topic will be "The Friendly Folk from Scrooby and What They Tell Us about Our World." Dr. Bailey is recently retired Professor of History, Abilene Christian University. He was chair of the Department of History from 1996-2011. During his forty years of teaching, eleven were in Tennessee and twenty-nine at ACU.

Dr. Bailey's academic interest is American social and intellectual history with an emphasis on the American South. He is author of two books and more than sixty articles in professional journals and other academic publications.

The Southern Quest for a Suitable Past, a book in progress, is a discussion of the social impact of how white Southerners interpreted their past from 1890 to the present. His hobbies include International travel, writing and sharing with friends short essays about English history.

SPIRITUAL AIMS THOUGHT TO PONDER

"But our citizenship is in heaven" Phil. 2:20. Here, the Apostle Paul is speaking about the Christian's heavenly citizenship. But I would suggest that our earthly citizenship devolves from God's desire that we be citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven. Qualities such as the Fruit of the Spirit, righteousness, love of God and our fellow man are all qualities of good citizenship on earth.


I think most of us would agree that every civilized, free society is based on an intelligent, educated citizenry. This is probably part of what the adopters had in mind when they adopted Permanent Object # 4 i.e., "TO DEVELOP in precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship.". Good citizenship must be taught and demonstrated! In recent years we've seen people when freed from years of totalitarian oppression, emerge with great difficulty in becoming an educated, assertive and service minded citizenship.

TO DEVELOP is an action concept! The end result is a citizenship that reflects education, action and service. The HOW is "in precept and example." Precept suggests we that we develop and teach intelligent thought processes that lead to responsible community behavior, i.e., good citizenship. Example suggests that we live lives that reflect rational think-

ing, good decision making, orderliness, appropriate assertiveness, and respect for others. SERVICE is our business. This too must be taught and demonstrated! In other words, lives that demonstrate to children and adults in our various communities good citizenship.

Kiwanis programs such as reading to youth, support of 4-H and FFA events, Boy Scouts, Boys and Girls Clubs, Ben Richey Boy's Ranch, etc. are all examples of how the Kiwanis Club of Abilene develops good citizenship in our community.
