The Memory Men Chorus Abilene Country Club, Noon, Wednesday, April 3rd, 2013



The Memory Men Chorus is the oldest choral group in Abilene having been founded in 1948. This year is our 65th Anniversary. The group is an all-male chorus located in Abilene and sing traditional and modern 4-part a cappella harmony music.

There is hardly any style or type of music that sounds more inspiring or moving than male's voices singing in harmony. We sing, gospel, patriotic, traditional and modern harmonies.

Harmony music is one of the few uniquely American art forms. The earliest reports of this style of a cappella music involved African Americans. The earliest documented quartets all began in barber-shops. In 1938, the first formal men's barbershop organization was formed and the Barbershop Harmony Society was founded. That society celebrates

its 75th Anniversary this month just as the Memory Men celebrate its 65th Anniversary.
