- The new officers and directors were inducted on Oct. 6 by Lt. Gov. Barry Rushing. Nancy Miller became the first lady president of the Kiwanis Club of Abilene.
- Carolyn Fudge won the drawing for a free trip to Vegas, Dallas or the Hill Country. She inducted one new member.
- Kiwanians donated 1,236 hours of work at the West Texas Fair.
- Russell Berry and Nancy Miller Co-Chairpersons started working on the T-O District Convention early in this year.
- The membership voted to raise the dues on Dec. 1 to \$30 per month.
- Roy Lewis, Foundation President announced that an anonymous member has offered to match dollar for dollar all donations to the Foundation between Dec. 1 and June 1, 1994 up to \$5000.00. We were able to raise the challenge and got the \$10,000 in the Foundation.
- The Community Service Committee chaired by Zelma Wade reported 17 hrs work for Hospice of Abilene, 80 hrs Habitat for Humanity, and 80 lbs of food for the Food Bank.
- It was Henry McGinty Day on January 19, 1994 when he was honored for his service to Kiwanis, Boy Scouting, State School, and the community of Abilene. He was presented with a 45 year Legion of Honor pin, a certificate and a book of Kiwanis Memories.
