NEW SUPERINTENDENT IN TOWN: DR. DAVID YOUNG

Abilene Country Club, Noon, Wednesday, October 28th



Almost three months into his position as the Superintendent of the Abilene Independent School District, Dr. David Young will be our speaker this Wednesday. As has been our custom with the past 5 Superintendents, the Kiwanis Club of Abilene has welcomed the new Superintendent to our city within a few months of taking this position.

Dr. Young is a 1990 graduate of Abilene Cooper, having moved here with his family when he was in the fourth grade because his father was stationed at Dyess Air Force Base. He received his undergraduate and doctoral degrees from Texas A&M University.

He had been serving as Superintendent of the Pampa Independent School District since 2012. Prior to moving to Pampa, he served as Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction for 3 years at Midway ISD. Before that he had served as principal at both the middle and high school levels while serving in the Bryan, Navasota and Grapevine-Colleyville ISDs.

Moving to Abilene with him is his wife, Amanda, who is also a 1992 graduate of Cooper High School. She is an elementary guidance counselor in the local district. You can tell by the names of their children how connected they are to the Abilene community. Their children have the names of local schools in the district: Austin who is a freshman at HSU, a daughter named Madison who is in the 11th grade (quite a runner and soccer player), and Jackson who is in the 8th grade.

You may not know that Greg is a pharmacist at Hendrick Medical Center. He shared how his new CD "Jump for Joy: came about. Greg and Beth have two grandchildren, Lillian and Ben. Lillian (Lily) is a miracle baby, born with a heart defect. Six days after she was born, Lily had open heart surgery to repair her heart. It was a tough time, but support made such a difference. She was in the hospital for 6 weeks and after 6 months received a clean report. Now at the age of 3, she is strong and healthy and cleared to play soccer! Ben was born at the Hendrick Jones wing a couple of years later. With the birth of these two, Beth and Greg decided it was time to get this music project going. It was the desire that proceeds of the project would go to Children's Miracle Network. Things came together with the help of many individuals. Everything on the CD is original and the music is good for children of all ages. 100% of the money raised goes to CMN. Greg led Kiwanians in singing the title song, "Jump for Joy", complete with motions. He also presented a CMN slide show. Greg's closing slide says it all: "The power of one person CAN make a difference in the life of a child!"

CD's can be purchased at the Hendrick Professional Pharmacy or at the Hendrick Gift Shop.

David Jones and Guy Lucas presented a check to Hendrick CMN in the amount of \$1000 in Greg's honor. With these funds, 50 "Jump for Joy" CD's will go to the Hendrick hospital for children. These funds are a second of three presentations from cup money donated in 2014-2015.


Pancake Dollars!
