Guinn Smith introduced Dr. Stan Allcorn, Senior Pastor of Pioneer Drive Baptist Church, as the speaker on April 12th. Dr. Allcorn shared about Easter. He talked about Nicodemus who became a secret silent follower of Jesus Christ. It was Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea who went to Pontius Pilot and asked if they could have Jesus' body. They took His body off the cross and buried him in the tomb. A day later, Nicodemus is searching for the disciples. Would he say to them, that is all He could do? Jesus' story did not end with "that's all you could do." Instead, as made clear by Apostle Paul in I Corinthians 15, the Easter event is the foundation of Christianity. "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless." And if Christ has not been raised, we are still in our sins. He came to be our Savior. Dr. Allcorn quoted Romans 1:4 "Jesus was declared to be the Son of God with power, by the resurrection from the dead." Easter was God's stamp of approval! Easter means Jesus is Lord! Easter means we do not have to fear death anymore! He rendered death powerless. He conquered death! It is not a tragic cry for help but a triumphant shout from a garden where the tomb is empty. Instead, there is a shout, "HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!" Easter means help and hope. The tomb is empty, the bars of death have


